



## Dr Agnes Mahomva

Dr Agnes Mahomva is a specialist public health physician (MBChB, MPH) with over 30 years' experience in managing public health programs at local and global level. She is Zimbabwe's COVID-19 Chief Coordinator in the Office of the President and Cabinet for the past two years from May 2020 responsible for coordinating and managing a whole of government and society national response. Prior to this, she was Zimbabwe's Secretary for Health and Child Care serving as the Chief Executive Officer for the Ministry of Health and Child Care. Here she also served as the Chair of the Global Fund Country Coordinating Mechanism (CCM) and facilitated collaborative work with diverse stakeholders. Dr Mahomva has in the past served as the Elizabeth Glaser Paediatric AIDS Foundation Country Director for the Zimbabwe program for 12 years from 2007.

Prior to this she served as Zimbabwe's national PMTCT program Coordinator for five years. In 2014 she received the USAID Auxilia Chimusoro leadership award for her work in HIV programming. Dr Mahomva served as the President of the Zimbabwe College of Public Health Physicians and the Zimbabwe Medical Association from 2012 to 2013 and from 2014 to 2018 respectively. She has in the past served on several boards in Zimbabwe including the Public Health Advisory Board, the Harare Central Hospital Teaching and Referral Hospital board and the University of Zimbabwe Council. Dr Mahomva is passionate about HIV programming with a focus on mothers and babies. She is currently a member of the World Health Organization (WHO) Global Accelerator for Paediatric Formulation Network (Gap-f) Committee responding to the paediatric treatment gap
